Rationale:

A school uniform identifies children within our school, promoting student allegiance. It also acts
as a means towards providing equality amongst children, regardless of socio-economic
background.

Aims:

- To encourage pride in our school.
- To provide security for children travelling to and from school.
- To encourage wearing of school uniform as it enhances school spirit and pride.

Implementation:

- Consultation between school community, alongside P&C and school staff, have determined standard of uniform and expectations.
- Once endorsed by school community, school principal is to be responsive to economic, personal and social factors.
- Should the school wish to change uniform, the school should announce its decision early in the year, allowing 12 months for the changes to be adhered to.
- School uniform should be chosen wisely with easy care fabrics selected.
- No student can be prevented from attending school, or placed in a position of embarrassment, because he or she is not wearing a school uniform.
- School uniform policy and school uniform requirements should be reviewed every five years and amended where necessary.

Evaluation:

• This policy and school uniform requirements will be reviewed every five years, or when issues arise, and amended where necessary.
